whom These Presents Do at May concern, WE, Sir Thomas Innes of Learney, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Baron of Learney, Kinneally and Ecclesiastical, Doctor of Laws, Clericale, Lord Lyon King of Arms send Greeting; WEIEREWS, William John MacInnis, Attorney and Counsellor at Law, sometime Mayor of Gloucester in the State of Massachusetts, United States of America, having by Petition unto Us of date 7 May 1900 set and on behalf of MURDOCK MACINNIS his deceased grandfather SIEGWON TFLIS the said Murdoch MacInnis was born in the year 1600 in the Isle of Skye and sailed from Oban on the ship "Fector" in 1820 arriving at Port Hastings, Cape Breton, Nova Scotia, Canada in the same year and became a pioneer settler and owner of a farm at Malagawatch, Cape Breton where he lived all his life and where he died circa 1865; THAT the said Murdoch MacInnis and his spouse Catherine MacLeod had many sons, the seventh of whom Murdoch MacInnis, born at Malagawatch aforesaid September 1842 and died at sea while in command of the schooner "Triton" 1 June 1893, Master Mariner, spouse of Mary Louise MacDonald, was father of the Petitioner; AND the Petitioner having prayed that there might be granted as for his said late grandfather such Ensigns Generall as might be found suitable and according to the uses of Arms, KNOW YE, THEREFORE, that we have Devised, and Do by These Presents Design, Ratify and Confirm as for the Petitioner's said late grandfather, Murdoch MacInnis, and unto his descendants, with such due and congruous differences as may hereafter be generally matriculated for them, the following Ensigns Generall, as depicted upon the margin hereof, and matriculated of even date with These Presents upon the 70th page of the 44th Volume of Our Public Register of All Arms and Bearings in Scotland, videlicet: — Quarterly; 1st, Gules, a castle of five towers Or, port and windows Coules; 2nd and 3rd, Or, upon a sea in base undy Azure and Argent, a lymphad Vert, flagged and five visible oars in action Coules; 4th, Gules, a cross Saltirewise with a milking human figure thereon Argent, accompanied by two cross-crosslets in the flanks, and as many cross-crosslets filches in chief and in base of the said cross all of the last. Above the Shield is placed an Ermine besilling his dexter with a Planting Cross doubled Or, and on a Wreath of the Tinctures is set for Crest a single acorn from the snowball bendingways, affixed to a close sleeve of the purple tunic of the Clans Conghaile, videlicet: — Yellow & (Pivot) Black, 24, Green, Black & Green, Black & Green, 32, Black 6, Green 6, Black 6, Black 6, Green 12, Red 4, (Centre Pivot) black flashes yellow with three buttons Or, grasping a bow Vert, stringed Tales, and in an Escrol over the same this motto GEIPEZ DAE OGUS CAN RIGGE, by designation of which Ensigns Generall he and his successors in the same are, amongst all Nobles and in all Places of Honour, to be taken, numbered, accounted and received as Nobles in the Noblesse of Scotland; IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF we have Subscribed These Presents and the Seal of Our Office is affixed —
